Hello Everyone!


I hope you all are doing well!



People would come up for some pancakes and Matthew would ask them if they knew the gospel, and then he would ask them if they wanted to know about the gospel; he would share it with them, as well as what Jesus has done in his life, then offer to pray for them. He got to have some really good conversations with people as a result and it was really awesome and inspiring to watch.

A couple of weeks ago was our spring break, and this year we decided to go to Moab, UT to serve at a pastor's retreat there. The retreat was put on by a guy named Steve Lummer who has a ministry where he travels to different popular outdoor places and trails around the country and he makes tacos for the hikers, backpackers, and bikers. He has come to CU a couple of times and made tacos at our Tuesday night service. During the week of our spring break, he put on a retreat called Desert Fathers. The point of the retreat was to provide a space for pastors to come and disconnect for a while and spend some time in solitude praying and seeking the Lord - free from distractions. The goal was for the pastors to be restored, mentally, physically, and spiritually during this time and the retreat seemed like it did that for the pastors that were there.

During the retreat, a lot of what we did was help with preparing food, and we got to interact with the pastors and participate in some of their discussion which was really beneficial for us and our students that were on the trip. We also got to do some awesome hikes in Arches National Park with our students. It was breathtakingly beautiful there, and the landscape in and around Moab feels like another planet. God's creation is truly spectacular. On the way back from Moab we stopped in Gunnison, CO for a couple of days to visit the Chi Alpha at the university there. This Chi Alpha was also started by former staff members that I knew at CSU. So, it was awesome to see them and catch up, as well as see how their ministry is doing, and talk with some of their students. It was really great trip with our students and everyone on the trip had a great time. It seemed like we all grew closer together, as well!
